2014 Library User Satisfaction Survey Highest Ratings since 1997

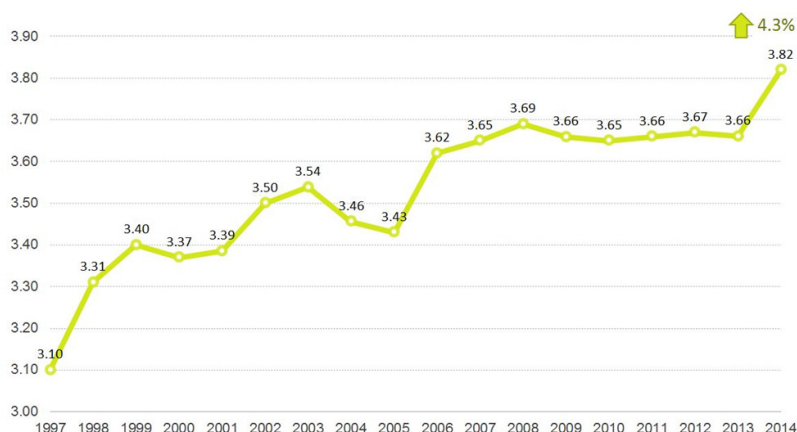
I would like to thank everybody who participated in the 2014 library user survey in March. We are absolutely delighted to find that we have received the highest user satisfaction ratings since 1997, the year the Library started to conduct annual survey. Due to limited budgets, library collection is always a concern. And yet, you may not be aware that as of 2014 the Library collection includes more than 514,000 books, bound journals, audio-visual

materials, and more than 1,036,000 E-books. In fact, we now have a higher ratio of E-Books per full-time equivalent (FTE) student compared to other JULAC Libraries. Still we realize that we don't have everything you need, and strongly encourage you to make additional purchase recommendations. Alternatively, we can help you acquire the desired materials through interlibrary loan.

The survey results indicated that computers, printing & photocopy equipment were some of your key concerns. Two standalone Express Printers capable of printing files directly from USB were installed to further enhance printing services. In the first

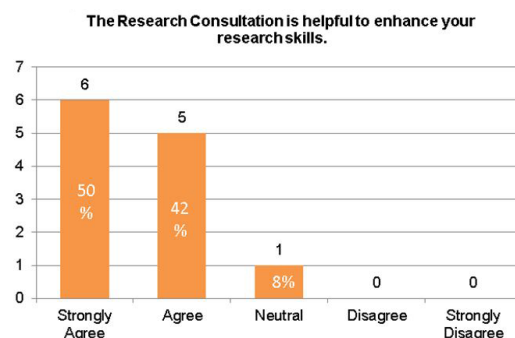

Research Consultation Service – What's the comments from users

As you may know that the Library is offering a personal one-to-one Research Consultation Service, but how the users felt about the service? According to the recent users feedback (Jan 2013–May 2014), 92% of users strongly agreed (50%) or agreed (42%) that the service was helpful to enhance their research skills. 91% of users gave an overall rating of Excellent (58%) or Good (33%) to the service. 100% of the users said that they would recommend the service to other students/colleagues.

Information Technology Fluency Test (ITF Test)

In order to equip students with essential IT knowledge and skills for their studies and future career development, starting from 2012-13, all students enrolling in a Lingnan undergraduate programme are required to pass the ITF Test as a requirement for graduation.

Library Information Literacy Workshops

The 1st term Library Workshops will start in Sep 2014. Online registration begins on 1 Sep 2014 (Mon), <http://www.library.ln.edu.hk/services/workshops>.

We offer different types of workshops that are designed to help you to make the best use of library resources and improve your research skills.

Students can earn more than 3 ILP credits (which used to limit to 3 ILP). Staff and students who completed three or more workshops will receive a certificate issued by the Library.



As "Information Literacy" is part of the syllabus of the ITF (Information Technology Fluency) Test, students are encouraged to enroll to the library workshops, as a preparation for the test.

Research Readiness Self-Assessment (RRSA)

RRSA was developed by the Central Michigan University of the United States. It is an assessment to measure student knowledge of understanding and using library resources & scholarly information, as well as their perceived research abilities. The Library introduced the RRSA for the new students during the New Student Orientation since 2012/13 academic year. Each student participant was required to complete 40 questions and would get an individual analysis report immediate after the assessment.

A total of 532 results were collected from the 2013/14 cohort of new students. The assessment results cover six categories in two big areas.

Perceived Research Skills reflected how the new students perceived themselves on their research and information skills.

Research & Library Experience reflected how often they would use library, access library website, discuss with library staff on a research topic, write a research paper, etc.

Browsing the Internet indicated the tendency of relying on popular search engine for scholarly research. (The higher the score means stronger reliance).

Obtaining Information covered the topics on keyword search, Boolean operators, primary vs secondary sources, reading call numbers, etc.

Evaluating Information showed the ability to locate information from different types of sources (peer-reviewed journal vs popular magazine) and judging the reliability and quality of information.

Understanding Plagiarism shows the student's awareness on the issues of copyright and plagiarism.

From the result, we noticed that there was room for improvement in certain areas of student's research skills and knowledge. We believed that the ability to find quality information on academic topics, conduct academic literature reviews, independent & critically evaluate the quality of information sources, access & use information ethically and legally are important qualities for student's lifelong learning.

The Library offered different types of service to help students in enhancing their information literacy such as the New Student Orientation programme, Guides@LU on the Library's website, Online Information Literacy Tutorial (access via Moodle), Information Literacy Workshops (some workshops are embedded in department's courses), and Research Consultation Services.

New Resources & Facilities

New E-books & E-databases

As we are committed to offer you the best resources, several new E-books & E-databases were acquired.

airiti Books 華藝中文電子書 - Provides access to over 1,300 Chinese ebooks on various subjects.

Direction of Trade Statistics – IMF's Direction of Trade contains value of exports and imports between countries and their trading partners, with history to 1980. Updated once a month, it contains over 100,000 quarterly and annual time series data.

Foreign Office Files for China – Provides online access to the completed British Foreign office files dealing with China, Hong Kong and Taiwan during 1919 – 1937 and 1949 – 1980.

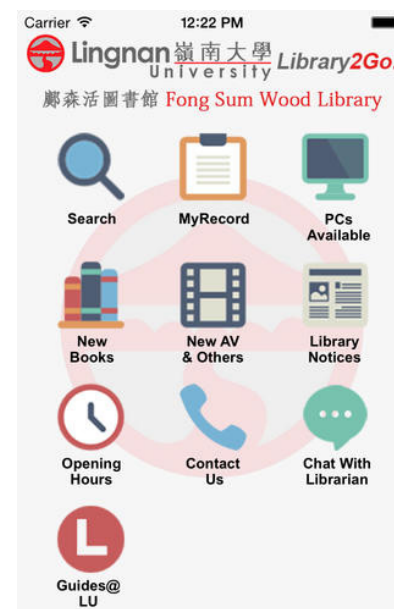
Industrial Statistics Database – Contains data for the period from 1963 to 2010 for 166 countries. Data are arranged according to International Standard Industrial Classification of All Economic Activities pertaining to the manufacturing sector, which comprises 23 industries for cross-country economic analysis.

The exhibition will showcase the collaborative postcards produced by Australian artists Carol Archer (Hong Kong), Anna Couani, Loene Furler, Kit Kelen (Macao), Sue Rawlinson and Virginia Shepherd, along with those made by around 85 students from four drawing classes over the past two years. The project comprises the exhibited works of collaborative drawing, two video works that explore the postcard-making process and the learning it entailed, and a catalogue. Past Event & Exhibition

Myanmar Perspective: 50 Paintings from a Changing Country

It was a valuable chance to take a glimpse of Myanmar through 50 paintings by Burmese artists. The exhibition was curated by Prof. Ian Holliday, a renowned political scientist of the University of Hong Kong with keen interest in Myanmar. We were delighted to have him to speak at the opening ceremony on 27 Feb, and gave a guided tour on 7 Mar, followed by a film show and panel discussion on the film, "The Lady", the story of Aung San Suu Kyi as she became the core of Burma's democracy movement, and her relationship with her husband.



Donation Ceremony of Mr. Lee Yuk-wang's collection of Lingnan Records

Lingnan Archives recently received a very valuable donation of Lingnan records from the family of Mr. Lee Yuk-wang (Lingnan alumnus of Class 1943; 李毓宏學長, 1943 年榮社). A donation ceremony, coordinated by Lingnan University Alumni Association, was held on 28 Jun 2014 at the Lingnan Archives in the 2nd floor of the Library. Ms. Margaret Lee Wing-yee, the daughter of Mr. Lee, representing her late father and family, presented the donation to Lingnan Archives, and highlighted the significance of the few key records.

The donation comprises of various unique Lingnan-related photographs, documents, publications, as well as memorabilia of the late Mr. Lee who attended Lingnan primary, junior and high school as well as Lingnan University. Of particular interests are his graduation certificates and awards received during his life as a Lingnan student during 1930s to 1943 and a letter prepared by Dr. Lee Ying-lam (President 1938-1948) in 1942 for the revival of Lingnan University at Tai-tuen (大村).



The Library is deeply appreciative of this valuable donation from Mr. Lee Yuk-wang's family. The records will add tremendous value to documenting the history of Lingnan University. We have begun to process this collection, selective records with enduring value will be digitized and made available online for public access.
