It's been a year since this newsletter was last published in August 2019 during which the library services were interrupted in different degrees by the social unrest and the COVID-19 pandemic. I understand the great impact this has created on your study and research and the huge challenges you must tackle. I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you for your patience and understanding for the need of the Library to continually revisit and adjust our services sometimes declining access to some patrons. Our staff quickly adapted to the change, acquiring more e-resources, moving as many services and workshops online as possible, and keep communicating with our staff and students via different online channels. This is not enough. We did not stop enhancing our services and facilities to welcome you back to the new academic term.

We have released our strategic plan 2019 – 2025 (https://www.library.ln.edu.hk/en/about/intro/vision) to set forth our strategic themes and goals to advance the University's strategic priorities. The Library has been re-organized to reflect the new demands for innovative library services in the digital age. A new Research Support Team has been set up to develop a new suite of research support services. A Learning Support team has also been created to focus our resources to meet your learning and teaching needs.

I am excited that the upcoming renovation has some significant progress. The University has approved to commence the construction work in mid-December 2020. We also obtained the approval from the Government. During the construction period, it is inevitable that you will experience inconvenience and noise. I sincerely call for your great patience during this period so that we can work for a new library with much improved space and facilities. We also made use of this summer to acquire new furniture, upgrade the space on the second and third floors and move out some books to create new study areas and to prepare for the renovation. We hope that when you can come back to campus, you will enjoy the new space created for you.

No matter how unprecedented the change has been, our commitment never changes - We are here to support you in your learning and research journey. Please stay tuned to our new updates in the new library website that will be launched in September.

- New Self-checkout Station and Book Sterilizer




ENHANCEMENTS IN 1-Search

To protect your personal data stored in the 1-Search system, we have delinked the check out record of the library materials (except for those transactions with fines and fees incurred).




LIBRARY WEBSITE REVAMPED!


5. Brow7ine
